<u>Assistant Editors</u> will help manage Associate Editors and Form and Accuracy Editors. Assistant editors will be vital in the final stages of the publication because they will transfer submissions from Word documents into the journal template and may serve as liaisons to submitted authors. 2-3 assistant editors will be selected.

Associate Editors primary serve as copy-editors during the final phase of publication. They ensure that embarrassing mistakes do not slip through the cracks in the final publishing stages. For example, a spelling mistake in a well-polished paper with thorough analysis ruins the creditability of the journal and the author's submission. Associate Editors may also be required to perform the duties of F&A Editors. There will be at least 2-3 Associate Editors.

Form & Accuracy (F&A) Editors primarily check citations for correct form and verify that quoted or cited sources were used accurately and in the correct context. There will be at least 6-8 F&A Editors.

<u>ALL</u> editors will assist in expanding the current database of university departments, research institutes, and think-tanks to whom we send our call-for-papers. Editors will be assigned one or more states. For example, a set number of editors will find all universities in State A and then find the contact information of the various departments in those universities like Political Science, Economics, International Relations, National Security Law, International Law, etc.

All editors will also read one or more submissions and provide a critique on each paper's suitability for publication. The Editor-in-Chief and Assistant Editors, in coordination with the SATSA Executive Board, will use these critiques to determine which papers are published.

Editors with regional specializations or technical backgrounds will critique papers suited to their background (if available).

Most of the journal's substantive work will be completed before Thanksgiving and during Winter Break.
