Selected authors will be invited to share their research at the conference (travel expenses and hotel paid for) and have their papers published in SATSA's *Journal on Terrorism and Security Analysis*.

Prior-completed works, including papers submitted to (but not yet published by) other publications, are perfectly acceptable.

Please send only near-completed or finished drafts. Paper length should be between 2,000-10,000 words. Please send all documents as attachments (Microsoft Word preferred), and include a cover sheet listing contact info (name, address, email, and telephone number), as well as institutional affiliation and paper title. Submissions should either use the Chicago Manual of Style format or Blue Book for citations.
